

# RAPTORS OVER YELLOWSTONE Itinerary & Details

FIELD SEMINAR - SUMMER 2024

**INSTRUCTOR:** Katy Duffy, M.S.

**INSTRUCTOR BIOGRAPHY:** Katy Duffy has studied owls, diurnal raptors and other birds in the Greater Yellowstone Ecosystem by banding, surveying and other techniques for more than 35 years. Katy loves to share her knowledge of avian ecology and identification. She worked for the National Park Service as a supervisory education ranger in Yellowstone and Grand Teton national parks for 32 years. Katy has a M.S. in ecology from Rutgers University.

**ACTIVITY LEVEL:** This course is activity <u>level 1</u> and students enrolled in this course are expected to be active participants. Be prepared to hike up to 1 mile per day, comfortably, through relatively flat terrain on maintained trails.

\*All field activities will be conducted as a group. If participants cannot meet the activity level expectations during the program, they may be restricted from participation in daily outings. Program itineraries or activities will not be altered to accommodate participants who cannot meet the expectations of the stated activity level.

LOCATION: Course begins at the Yellowstone Forever classrooms located in Gardiner, MT.

**PROGRAM DATES & TIMES:** The program begins at 7:00 p.m. on Saturday, September 21, 2024, and goes through Sunday, September 22, 2024, at 5:00 p.m.

**LODGING CHECK-IN & CHECK-OUT:** No lodging is provided for this course, however, there may be limited lodging available through Yellowstone Forever at the Yellowstone Field Overlook Campus. # **PROGRAM ITINERARY**

Would you like to learn more about raptor identification and ecology? Would you like to see perched and flying raptors to enhance your identification skills? You will first spend classroom time looking at a presentation of images, including perched and flying raptors and their usual habitats, then you will spend hours in the field observing raptors during migration!

The itinerary is designed to take advantage of the best opportunities in the park, but may be adjusted to adapt to weather conditions, wildlife activity, holidays, and road construction.

The details and timing of the agenda are subject to change.

#### Day 1 Welcome

The program starts with an evening orientation. You will get to know one another and be introduced to the program. Throughout the evening, the itinerary and seminar key concepts will be discussed, as well as what to expect to pack for the field each day.

#### Day 2 Raptor migration.

You will first view a PowerPoint of images of raptors found in Yellowstone. Then you will head into the park to look for and observe migrating raptors. Viewing of raptors will entail comfortably sitting in lawn chairs in appropriate habitat for looking for and watching perched and flying raptors. The class will end with a summary.
